- » Please check your porch columns, railings, window trim, corner boards, and fences. Many of these areas have accumulated mildew, mold, and algae from daily rainfall.
- » Tips for proper mulching of trees: keep mulch away from the tree trunk, spread mulch to a diameter of at least three feet, and the maximum depth should be around three to four inches.
- Please check the sidewalks that line your property. Residue build up is not only an eyesore, it can also cause sidewalks to become slick and hazardous
